In the Book of Worship of the United Methodist Church there is a service of Covenant Renewal, written by Mr. Wesley himself. In it we find these words.

"Let us, therefore, go to Christ, and pray: Let me be your servant, under your command. I will no longer be my own. I will give up myself to your will in all things.

Be satisfied that Christ shall give you your place of work.
Lord, make me what you will.
I put myself fully into your hands: put me to doing, put me to suffering, let me be employed for you, or laid


aside for you, let me be full, let me be empty, let me have all things, let me have nothing. I freely and with a willing heart give it all to your pleasure and disposal." (p 291 BOW)

The service is most used at this time of year, when the Christmas season yields to Epiphany and the calendar on the wall needs to be replaced with a new one. We take stock of our own relationship with Jesus Christ, and yield again to his control over our lives. Yielding control over ourselves to another, even to God, is not a popular idea in the world around us, but the world does not know God as we who already know Christ do. God's plan for us is perfect, and vielding to the perfect plan of God for us is all that God requires. I pray God's blessings on all, and Happy New Year.


