# The Messenger

As I sit here today, almost at the end of March, I see things are quite different than they were only a few short weeks ago. The president of our country, and the governor of our state are working with all officials at all levels, to advise us on how to avoid getting sick from a new virus that is exploding all over the world. This disease is killing many who have lived long among us and have conditions that contribute to overall weakness in the ability to fend it off. The government is advising all who are over 60 and especially those who have the underlying conditions to separate from others who might carry it to them. Our ministries have taken on new forms in these days, but we are finding ways to pray together through email, and our updated lists are now being sent out with the prayers and sermons so you can participate at home in that way. All of our in-person ministries are suffering as a result of this personal distancing, and will continue to wait for such a time as we are once again able to meet together.

I am trying in these days to maintain a phone contact with all the congregation. I am no longer able to maintain my office hours in the church during the week per the guidance of our bishop. But I am available on Sunday mornings to answer any questions you may have about the sermon. We have also made available a delivery
